A new intake of apprentices have embarked on their careers at DEUTZ AG, with the Company welcoming 30 young women and men to the site in Cologne.

During the induction event, Dr Andreas Strecker, member of the DEUTZ Board of Management, wished the young people good luck for their first day of work.
